Guidelines for Applicants

This scholarship application is to be used by the children of members of the New York State Professional Servers Association (NYSPPSA) who are eligible and wish to apply. Please follow all instructions to complete this application. ***There is additional information required to complete your application.*** It is your responsibility to gather and submit these materials. The deadline for submission of all applications, complete with accompanying materials, is June 15. Any applications received after this date will not be considered.

Eligibility

Applicants must be either high school seniors, or freshmen attending an accredited undergraduate college, university or technical college. Freshman must be enrolled full time – 12 or more credit hours. Applicant's sponsor must be a current NYSPPSA member in good standing. Qualified children include natural children, adoptive children, grandchildren, and stepchildren.

Qualifying Institutions

Scholarship recipients must plan to attend college in the first Fall following the award announcement. Qualifying institutions include any accredited public or private, two or four-year college, university or technical school.

Requirements

- Completed and signed application
- Official transcripts of grades
- SAT or ACT exam results
- Required Essays

Incomplete applications will automatically be disqualified.

Review Process

The Scholarship Committee will review and select after considering the applicant's grades, extracurricular activities, employment experience and evaluations. Each committee member will receive a copy of the applicant's materials. Each committee member will evaluate each package and fill out a score sheet for each applicant. Each committee member will return the score sheets to the committee Chairperson, who will in turn, tabulate the scores and determine the winner. Only one scholarship will be awarded each year. The amount of the award will be decided yearly by the Scholarship Committee. All decisions made by the Scholarship Committee are final and cannot be appealed.
